## **Learning Objectives**

- Knowledge Acquisition Participants will be able to summarize key factors related to perinatal suicidality, including its prevalence, unique risk factors during the perinatal period, and the cultural considerations necessary for effective assessment
- Skill Development in Client Centered Approaches-Attendees will develop practical skills in conducting client centered assessments with perinatal individuals, fostering a deeper understanding of how to build rapport, use appropriate screening tools, and integrate cultural sensitivity in suicide risk assessment.
- Application of Collaborative Intervention Strategies -Participants will be able to apply collaborative and client centered intervention strategies when working with perinatal clients at risk of suicidality. This includes engaging clients in safety planning, involving their support systems, and providing psychoeducation on coping skills, with an emphasis on tailoring interventions to individual cultural contexts.
