Boundaries. Burnout. Betrayal. & Resilience as Resistance: Avoiding the "Groopification" of Self-care, Identifying your Values, Creating Communities of Care & Generating True Resilience from Social Supports.

Learning Objectives

- Understanding the Evolution of Self-Care: Participants will explore the historical context and evolution of self-care, delving into its misconceptions and the Four Pillars of Real Self-Care by Pooja Lakshmin, to recognize the foundations and principles behind genuine self-care practices.
- Identifying Risks and Building Resilience in Healthcare Professions: Attendees will analyze the clinical triad of burnout, encompassing the vulnerabilities of nurses, therapists, and health providers to burnout, secondary trauma, compassion fatigue, and vicarious trauma. We will explore strategies to counter these challenges, emphasizing rest as resilience, coping with ambiguous loss, and the significance of unresolved mourning.
- **Transitioning from Individual to Collective Care:** Participants will examine the shift from individual self-care to fostering communities of care. They will explore the misconceptions surrounding modern self-care, the value of developing communities of care, and the benefits of companies, hospitals, and non-profits that prioritize understanding human capital. Additionally, we will delve into the importance of "stay interviews" and their role in organizational growth, to compliment the more common "exit interviews".
