- Utilize evidence-based tools to recognize and risk-stratify suicidal ideations and intentions in children and adolescents.




In Memoriam

Mohsen Ziai, MD an Iranian native who represented the eighth generation of his family to pursue a medical career and who played a crucial role in the growth of what is now Inova Children's Hospital in Fairfax County, passed away March 27, 2013 at his home in Great Falls, Virginia.

In 1982, Dr. Mohsen Ziai became the Chairman of Pediatrics at Inova Fairfax Hospital, inspiring the physician community with his vision of a children's hospital in Northern Virginia. His 17 years as Chairman of Pediatrics produced rapid growth including establishment of the only PICU in Northern Virginia, the opening of the Women's and Children's Building, the inception of the Inova Pediatric Center, the initiation of the pediatric cardiac surgery program and establishment of a pediatric residency program. The establishment in his honor of this continuing medical education conference is a natural extension of Dr. Ziai's approach to the promotion of child health through service to the community.

The Mohsen Ziai M.D. Pediatric Endowment was established in 1991 to support pediatric education, research, and program development. Thanks to many colleagues and friends, as well as former students and residents in Fairfax, Rochester, New York, and around the world, the balance reached \$1.9 million dollars including interest before being tapped by Dr. Ziai's successors. The chairs have expended well over one million dollars toward major support to this annual conference, multiple REACH Courses provided free of charge to local pediatricians, establishment of a child abuse professorship, including almost half a million dollars for neonatal neurodevelopmental research. Additional support by current beneficiaries of the Endowment is needed to continue such enrichment of support to community pediatric caregivers. 
